All children should bring a cold, peanut safe lunch from home. Milk will be provided by the center. A morning and an afternoon snack will be served along with breakfast until 8:00 am. A \$1.00/day fee will be charged for each child in attendance for more than 2 hours per day or here over the lunch hour.
